


The first lesson of the day is Maths.

The children sing songs together in the Music room. Martin is very surprised that Sam is so bad at singing.




The last lesson of the day is PE.

Martin!







Tips for parents and teachers

BEFORE READING

- Look at the front cover. Ask 'What do you think this book is about?'
- If the child is familiar with this book series, point to Martin and Ms Tong and ask 'Who is this?'
- Ask 'Who are some of your classmates? Which of your classmates are your good friends?'

WHILE READING

- Pages 6 and 7. Point to the picture of Martin and ask 'How does Martin feel now? Why? Is it bad to copy answers from other people? Why?'
- Pages Io and II. Point to the picture of Martin and ask 'How does Martin feel now? Why? Do you sometimes feel jealous of your friends and classmates?'
- Pages 16 and 17. Ask 'Do you like volleyball? What other sports do you like? What sports are you good at?'
- Pages 18 and 19. Point to the picture of Martin and ask 'How does Martin feel now? What do you think Martin will do next? What would you do if you were Martin?'

AFTER READING

- Ask 'Do you think Martin and Sam will be good friends in the future? Why? / Why not?'
- The child can draw a picture of themselves and their friends in their class. Encourage the child to tell you about their friends and why they like them.
